

Antiquity - Instructions for online access

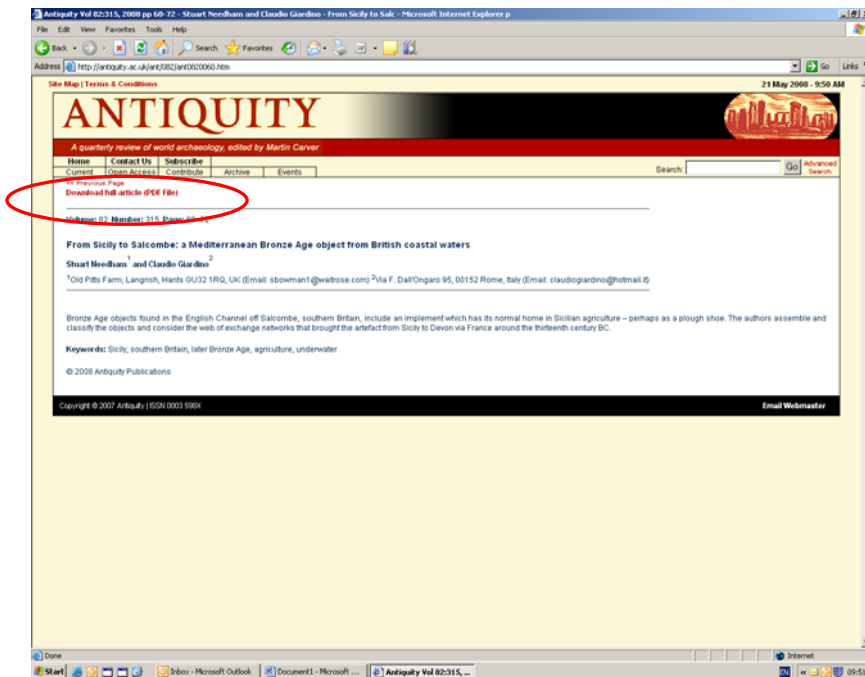
Antiquity's website is <http://antiquity.ac.uk/>

Much of Antiquity's website is on Open Access, i.e. it is free to all users with no need to log in.

However, to access articles from our **Current Issue** or the **Archive** you will need your **username** and **password**. These should have been sent to you by Portland Customer Services when you subscribed to the journal.

If you do not have a username and password, or have forgotten your details, please contact Portland Customer Services on 0044 (0)1206 796351 or at sales@portland-services.com.

To access an article from Antiquity's Current Issue or Archive click on **Download full article (pdf file)** in the top left of the abstract screen.



You will then be presented with a screen called **'How to access this article'**. This screen will tell you all the different ways of accessing Antiquity's articles. If you have a personal subscription to Antiquity, please click on **LOG IN** at the top of the screen.

A box will then appear asking for your **USERNAME** and **PASSWORD**. Please enter the details as provided by Portland Customer Services.

Click **OK** and you should now be taken to the full text of the article.

The first time you log in you may find that this does not work at the first attempt, please re-enter your username and password and click OK again. If the problem persists, please contact Portland Customer Services at subscriptions@portland-services.com where they will be happy to assist you.

Once you have successfully logged in, you may view as many full text articles as you wish within the session without the need to enter your username and password each time. If you quit the session, however, you will need to log in again to resume accessing the articles.
